

## ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS FOR SMITH & WESSON BODYGUARD G10 GRIPS

**1.** Before starting to work, **MAKE SURE THE FIREARM IS UNLOADED.**

*Tools needed to install grip:*

- Hammer
- 3mm Roll Pin Punch
- Block with hole (to drive roll pin through)

**2.** To remove the stock grip that is installed on your firearm: Place the grip on block with the roll pin over the block hole. Using the hammer, carefully tap pin out of frame and existing grip. Do not lose pin! Pull stock grip downward to remove from frame.

**3.** In the reverse manner of removal, install new grip by sliding upward with a radial motion. Be sure the grip is fully seated and the pin holes line up between the grip and frame tang. Check alignment by first by sliding pin punch through.



**IMPORTANT:** Check all functions of your firearm after grips are installed. **Test-fire your firearm.** This is especially important if weapon is to be used for law enforcement duty.

**4.** Insert the stock roll pin through the new grip into the frame. Carefully use the hammer and the roll pin punch to tap pin into position centering it within the grip until equal lengths are visible on both sides.



### A FEW WORDS ABOUT FIT

It is a fact that firearm frame dimensions vary from firearm to firearm. No grip is shipped unless it fits and functions on **our** guns properly. Please keep this in mind.

It is imperative to make sure that every firearm functions properly with after-market grips installed. Although the grip functions properly on our firearms, it is the user's responsibility to check all functions of a firearm after new grips are installed. This is especially important if the weapon is to be used for law enforcement duty. If you do not feel competent to check the proper function yourself, we suggest visiting your gunsmith to check this for you.

**It is important to test-fire a pistol fitted with new grips before using it in the field.**
